INTERESTED IN SELLING YOUR BROMELIADS AT PLANT-0-RAMA?

Our Club Board reminds sellers that plants must be exceedingly clean and disease free to reflect the high quality of our sale plants. If a seller wishes to receive 75% of the sales price, each plant should be **double-tagged**. One tag will be cut off by the cashier to record its sale. Do not use wooden sticks or thick tags that cannot be cut easily. Tag the plants securely to prevent "tag switching" before the customer pays for them. Identify the plant name, write your initials, and write the price in whole dollars with no cents. Writing must be legible. You may drop off plants on Friday during setup. Or you may arrive as early as 9:00 a.m. on Saturday and have your plants completely ready by opening at 10:30 a.m. The sale is open from 10:30 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. on Saturday. Please remove any remaining plants by 4:30 p.m. on Saturday. Left-over plants will be used for future plant tables at our meetings.

If you are selling plants, be prepared to assist at the sale in any area: Friday setup, sales, cashier assistant, bagging, and assisting customers to their cars. Also, be prepared to discuss your plants with customers. Any plants you wish to donate to the club do not need double tags. Club members will staff the cashier area. Payment will be in cash, our Square credit card device and checks only from a member's account. Our treasurer will tally all sales. Sellers' earnings will be computed as 75% less 75% of the sales tax. Payment will be issued by the treasurer. Please note: Only SVBS members may sell plants at Sherman Gardens. Please wear your name tag to gain free entry to the Gardens and the sales area. The limited sales space is to be shared courteously among sellers.



Tillandsdia Workshops:

In late May, our first workshop for new members was held at Mary's garden in Huntington Beach. It was well-attended and Mary is shown demonstrating some of her techniques at left. On June 19, we visited Zulema's garden in Fountain Valley for our second workshop. She demonstated her technique for making *Tillandsia ionantha* balls (below). We also had an opportunity to enjoy Zulema's amazing garden. Mary (below left) did additional demonstrations and Kerry explained how he makes his bowls and famous *Tillandsia* birds (below right).
